Thank you for choosing Casa de Cooper's Studio Paz as your Vacation Villa in San Juan del Sur Nicaragua. We want to help make your stay with us a memorable one and one that you won't forget.

Following is some information that you will find helpful as you plan your trip:

Little Tips

Do not bring Travelers checks. They are not timed honored currency exchange system for travelers in Nicaragua. Best to bring only Credit cards and Cash Cards that can be used in Cash Machines (remember to have an authorized PIN Codes as you will not be able to obtain them while in Nicaragua.

Also, report to your Credit Card companies that you will be traveling in Nicaragua to prevent having to have your identify checked after your first three purchases or credit uses.

U.S.Dollars are accepted throughout Nicaragua. Bring a mixture of large and small bills. Most businesses will not change nor accept \$100 bills. No one will accept bills with damage, including the tiniest mark or tear.

Casa de Cooper does furnish you a cell phone with MoviStar. We start with C\$100 worth of minutes. It is up to our Guest to buy additional minutes if needed.

The U. S. Dollar is accepted for payment of goods. However, any change given will be given in local currency. The exchange rate changes on a daily bases so, check the Del Sur News for the exact exchange rate. As of 17 December the rate is 27.5 C\$ to the U\$1.00.

Arriving in Managua

On your airplane trip to Nicaragua, you will be given some forms to fill out. These forms will be used in securing your tourist visa. Be sure you bring a pen to use in filling out the forms.

When arriving by airplane you will arrive in Managua (MGA), the capitol of Nicaragua. You will depart the plane and head to Immigration, which is very simple. Follow the crowd. You will descend the escalator and head direct to the Immigration check-in. (We suggest you go to the furthest booth as it seems to be the least crowded.)

If you are traveling with family, go to the Immigration officer when he motions you taking the entire family. Have your passports ready and present to the officer. You will be charged U\$10.00 for each person for your tourist visa. Make sure you have the correct change as they do not offer change.

After Immigration, you will head to the baggage claim area. Now is a good time to use the restrooms as your drive ahead is about 2 to 2/12 hours. Be sure to have your claim check handy as they will be checked as you claim your baggage and exit the area. You can use one of the baggage handlers if you desire or just simple gather your own luggage.

After retrieving your luggage, proceed to Customs where you will be required to put your baggage through the X-ray machine. If you are motioned to go for a bag check, just calmly walk to the area and let them check your bags. Most tourist are not motioned to the area but in case they do, just cooperate with the baggage checker.

After all this is completed, you will exit the airport. If you have hired transport, look for a driver holding a sign with your name on it. If you can't find your driver, they will find you.

If you are renting a car, please read what we share with you about driving in Nicaragua. Car rentals are available in San Juan del Sur, if you feel you need your own transportation.

Let us know if you want to arrange transportation and we can assist.

Car Rental

If this is your first time in Nicaragua, you might want to consider hiring a professional transport company to bring you to Casa de Cooper. We will be happy to arrange that transport for you.

There is car rental in San Juan del Sur. We have Avis, Dollar and several others that have offices in the area. Dollar Rental has an office on site of the Pelican Eyes Resort for your convenience.

Tips on Driving in Nicaragua

We offer this information for your knowledge and for our guests that are not familiar with driving in Nicaragua.

Driving in Nicaragua is not like driving in the United States of America. The roads are not marked with highway signs and the driving laws are very strict. Expect to be stopped by the police for insurance and registration checks at several "check points". Here are some things you might encounter and others that you should be aware of while driving in Nicaragua:

- 1. The police have 2 check points that are active 24/7. One is at the intersection of the Pan-American highway at Diriamba and the other is at the "silver bridge" on the Pan-American highway.
- 2. There are occasional "surprise" stops that is mainly for drug traffic checking.
- 3. Police like to stop tourist for random checks. Expect some of this stops to be on your way to San Juan del Sur.
- 4. When stop at the check points, you will need to show proof of insurance, vehicle inspection reports, ID such as passports and driver's license. If you are renting a car, be sure to ask for proof of insurance and vehicle inspection reports so you know where they are in the vehicle and can readily access them when needed.
- 5. The main traffic offense is crossing the solid yellow line when passing other vehicles along with speeding in school areas when students are visible along the highway.
- 6.. Watch for motor cycles, bicycles, pedestrians walking, horses and cattle grazing on the side of the road.

If by chance, you have a violation, the police will keep your Driver's License and issue a traffic violation ticket. Your driver's license can be reclaimed in a few days at the police station in the area where you received the traffic violation.

If by some unfortunate circumstances you are involved in a traffic accident, the police will take your driver's license. Depending on the severity of the accident, both drivers involved will be remanded to jail until the situation is investigated and resolved. If this happens, you should contact your Embassy for assistance.

Driving Directions from Managua Airport to Casa De Cooper, San Juan del Sur

When you leave the airport you will turn right onto the extension of the Pan-American highway.

- a. Head towards the town of Tipitapa. You will go through a "round about" but keep heading straight.
- b. When reaching Tipitapa, there is a large service station on the right. At the intersection, turn right and head straight through Tipitapa.
- d. When reaching the intersection of the main Pan-American highway, you will merge left on to the Pan-American highway.
- e. Drive through both Diriamba and Nadaime headed towards Masaya. The Uno Station in is a good place to stop for "potty" stop and snacks.
- f. When reaching Masaya, drive through the town. There are 2 stop lights on the highway you will go through.
- g. When you reach the roundabout at the end of Masaya, you will take the right exit of the roundabout headed for Catarina.
- h. Follow the road going through Catarina and down the hill to an intersection where you will take the right merge. This will take you to the main Pan-American highway.
- i. Follow this road to an intersection where you will take a left merge on to the Pan-American highway.
- j. Follow the highway headed for Rivas and driving through Rivas to La Virgen. There will be a highway sign showing San Juan del Sur turning to the right when you reach La Virgen. At this point you are about 30 minutes from Casa de Cooper.
- k. As you enter San Juan del Sur, you will pass the Pali grocery store on the left. Continue driving but do not pass the Uno Service Station.
- I. Just before the Uno, you will turn left following the road to the top of the hill. Always bear left and stay on hard top road.
- m. The road will turn to a hard pack road with a white wall at the edge of the road. Follow the hard packed road to the guard gate.
- n. Go through the guard gate telling the guard you are going to Casa de Cooper.

- o. Take the first road to the left and follow that road to the end.
- p. You have arrived. The total time is about 2-1/2 hours.

Internet

There are 4 different private Internet networks serving Casa de Cooper because of the concrete and steel walls. The Internet signal in some parts of the Casa may be weak.

These are the private networks:

Casa de Cooper (good connection in bedrooms of Vista Paraiso)

Casa de Cooper_netgear2 (this is the strongest in Vista Paraiso)

Casa de Cooper_netgear5 (best for Vista Paraiso living area of house)

Romantica2 (best for Casita Romantica **Pool Side** (Strongest for Casita Romantica)

The password for each of the services is **Given to You on Arrival**

As you move about the property, you may have to re-sign in to the different networks. If you are a guest in Casita Romantica, the Romantica network will be the strongest. In Casa Vista Paraiso, use either Casa de Cooper_netgear2 or Casa de Cooper networks. The Casa de Cooper_netgear5 is the strongest network since it operates at 5 GHz.

Electrical and Air-conditioning

There are occasional power outages. During these outages we will do our best to provide electrical service with our 25KVA back-up generator.

Exterior pathway lights will be turned on each night at 5 pm. Each patio has their own electrical switch, both inside and outside, to control their individual patio lights. If they are too bright, you may turn them off.

When leaving your room, please turn-off lights and set air-conditioning to 78 degrees.

Bathrooms

Our sewer system is very sensitive. In each of the bathrooms we have placed a trash receptacle for disposing of toilet tissues and any other personal items. Please use these receptacles. If you have a problem with the sewer, please let housekeeping know.

Water is a precious commodity in Nicaragua. We appreciate your help to conserve. If you need fresh towels, please place the used towels and washcloths on the floor.

Housekeeping

We provide housekeeping Monday through Sunday with the exception of Thursday. Our housekeepers name is Keyla. She will be happy to assist you.

The bedding is changed each Wednesday of the week for guests that are staying on weekly bases.

<u>Groundskeeper</u>

Our Groundskeeper is Gabriel Zamora who will be happy to help you with your luggage and or grocery delivery. He is available Monday through Sunday with the exception of Saturday when he attends the University.

Gabriel works from 8-5. He will be taking care of the landscape and doing light maintenance.

Drinking Water

We do provide drinking water for the water dispensers. The charge for a 5 gallon bottle of water is \$5. If you want new water, let housekeeping know and they will see to it that it is replaced.

Outdoor BQ's

We furnish a gas grill for your use while staying with us. The charge for the gas bottle is at no charge. If tank is empty, allow the staff to know. Be sure to check the tank before starting to use as it is not monitored by staff. BQ utensils are in the kitchen. You will have to use the propane lighter that is with the utensils to light the BQ.

Private Plunge Pool

During the windy season if can be difficult to keep the pools clear. Be assured the water is sanitized. Our Groundskeeper checks the chlorine and PH levels each day and treats as necessary.

What is Rappelling

Repel is a specialized mountaineering technique that allows you to do a controlled descent down a rope on a vertical faces like a cliff or wall through a device that provides friction.

Also known as Abseiling. Rappelling is the most used vertical descending technique and it is used worldwide for rescuer by firefighters, special forces and police, also in construction in high buildings and for mountaineering.



How you do it?

The climbing rope is anchored to a cliff with artificial anchors like cams, pitons and bolts or natural anchors like trees and boulders. the climber then uses a rappel device which utilizes the friction of the rope through the device to control his descent as he literally slides down the fixed rope to a ledge or the cliff base.

All the gear we use are from the top two world known brands: Petzl and Black Diamond, both with quality and safety U. S. Standards, designed to resist extreme conditions of weather and use.

BALDO'S SURF LESSONS

Duration: 2 hours

Location: Usually Remanso beach, the best spot for beginners.

Includes:

- surfboard rental

- rash guard (lycra shirt)

- transportation to the beach

(Picture is of First Day - 10 year old.)

Theory:

We start on the sand with a little talk about safety in the water, how to avoid accidents with your board and with other surfers; depending on the conditions I talk about the waves, how they break, and how to be prepare for them.

Practice on the Sand:

We practice on the sand the few steps you need to do to stand up on the board, working on your body position, balance on the board and timing. We repeat this many times with the intention to get muscle memory (follow the steps without thinking, your body start doing it by "itself").

Practice in the Water:

Then we get in the water (shallow part) where you get pushed into the waves so you can focus on doing the steps you practice before on the sand to stand up on the board.

Catching Waves:

Once we see that you are standing up with no problem and you learned to have some control of the board, then you start paddling to catch you own waves working on your timing and paddling techniques.

Follow Up Lessons:

For follow up lessons we recommend to go on your own at least one day (after the first lesson) and then get the follow up lesson to correct mistakes and make small adjustments. Also, we focus more on the timing, learn to read the wave's direction and speed.
